Hearing Services

Full diagnostic audiometry services are provided to all people in the Byron Shire.

There are two hearing clinics held each week - One at Byron Bay Community Health Centre and the other at Mullumbimby Community Health Centre.

- All services are by booked appointments only. Phone the Community Health Centre to book.
- Allow about 1 hour for a hearing assessment
- Generally children are booked in for the morning appointments and adults in the afternoon
- This is a free service.

<u>Referrals</u>

Referrals can be made by anyone – parents, carers, teachers, GPs, Specialists and other health professionals.


- Hearing services are able to be provided in Byron Shire to all children over 3 years up to 18 years of age.
- Children <u>do not</u> require a doctor's referral.
- All adults <u>do</u> require a doctor's referral.
- Hearing Clinics for toddlers and children under 3 years of age are provided at Community Health Centres in the Tweed Byron Network. For Appointments contact Audiometry Nurse at Tweed 07 5506 5400

- When booking children with special needs for hearing appointments please tell reception so they can make a double booking and allow adequate time for the assessment.
- Hearing Services for <u>private</u> industry screening or monitoring not available

What to look for with a hearing loss?

- Lack of attention
- Selective hearing
- Delayed speech and language development
- Inconsistent responses
- Speaking too loudly or too quietly
- Learning difficulties
- Reduced ability to discriminate between sounds eg: h, s, sh, th, f
- Difficult behaviour/ frustration
- Impaired recall and comprehension
- Peering at speaker's face
- Always asking "what?" or "pardon"



Having a hearing loss is a hidden disability and causes serious problems for learning, communication and social interaction.
